Florida Humanities Council 2016-2017

The programs of the Florida Humanities Council annually reach Floridians in every region of the state, from our reading and discussion programs and engaging Teachers' Institutes, to our exhibitions partnering with the Smithsonian Institution, and summer seminars for teachers and high school students, we are dedicated to connecting Floridians in community-based programming that brings us together and deepens our understanding of Florida.

Museum on Main Street
 Museum on Main Street is a partnership program that brings Smithsonian Institution exhibits, resources, and programming to small towns across the state. These high-quality exhibitions are designed to bring wonderful attention to underutilized and local economies and serve as a launching point for storytelling and local pride.

Smart Funding for Local Humanities Projects
 Since 2012, the Florida Humanities Council has awarded more than \$40 million in federal funding statewide in support of the development and preservation of exceptional cultural resources and public programs. These projects help preserve Florida's rich history and unique experiences, engage and educate citizens, and create opportunities for reflecting on the future of our state.

Florida Stories Walking Tour app
 Our smartphone walking tour app allows users to take control of their own Florida stories with an emphasis on local history, culture and traditions. Combining a statewide database, the app creates individualized cultural tourism itineraries that enhance knowledge and appreciation of local history, more than 20 local and on-airline in 2016.

2016-2017 Our Year in Numbers Statewide

- \$244,000 awarded in grant funding for local humanities projects
- 186,498 people attended public programs statewide
- 124,382 visitors to Smithsonian Institution "Museum on Main Street" exhibits in 28 small towns
- 40,000 FHSOIM employees reached more than 100,000 readers
- 23,471 students participated in the "Pretty Out Loud" composition statewide
- 4,827 people attended reading and discussion programs in public libraries
- 611 teachers and students attended seminars on topics ranging from Florida agriculture to St. Augustine's rich history

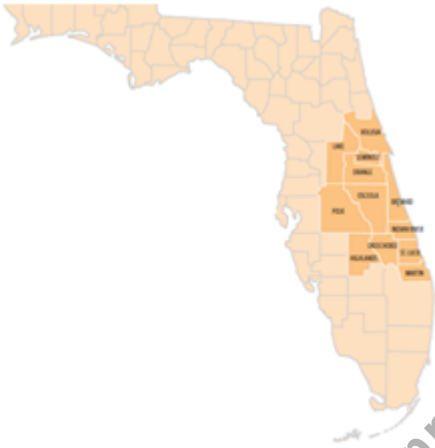
