**Grant Funding for Local Humanities Projects**  
Since 1971, the Florida Humanities Council has awarded more than \$100 million in federal funding to support the development and presentation of humanistic cultural resources and public programs. These projects help preserve Florida's rich history and heritage, promote civic engagement and community dialogue, and provide opportunities for learning on the future of our state.

**Museum on Main Street**  
Museum on Main Street is a pioneering program that brings Smithsonian Institution exhibitions, resources, and programming to small towns across the state. These high-quality exhibitions are designed to bring national attention to underrepresented and local communities and serve as a learning point for developing our public good. Smithsonian sites report an average attendance increase of more than 50% over the program's life.

**Florida Stories Walking Tour app**  
Our innovative walking tour app allows users to explore behind-the-scenes of Florida's rich history and culture on their mobile devices and provides a unique platform for users to explore and learn about Florida's rich history. The app's 100 stories have been narrated by more than 100 local people annually.
