Apalachicola Riverkeeper (Franklin)	The Apalachicola: Stories from the River	\$5,000	Apalachicola Riverkeeper will partner with WFSU to create a short documentary that explores the forces threatening the river system and the myriad impacts on the people, culture and economy of Florida.
Cedar Key Arts Center (Levy)	Florida's Wild Landscapes Through the Lens of Clyde Butcher	\$3,825	The Cedar Key Arts Center will host an exhibition of works by acclaimed photographer Clyde Butcher as well as public presentation by the artist.
Flagler College (St. Johns)	A Gilded Age, Great War and Global Influence	\$4,000	Flagler College's annual lecture series for 2017-18 will focus on the centennial anniversary of the Great War, the Russian Revolution, the waning of the Gilded Age, and the U.S.'s changing international role over the past 100 years.
